



THIS MONTH'S TOPIC:

Being A Good Friend



01

Serve breakfast and hand out raffle tickets (one per family).

02

Have dads introduce their kids and say, "I'm proud of (child's name) this month because _____."

03

A) Video:
Before the video, say: **"The people we know and love make life special. Everything is better with friends. Let's watch some boys who discovered that being a good friend has resulted in making a great friend."**

04

B) Activity: Human Bingo (Supplies needed: a pen/pencil and a Bingo Card printed for every player)
Before the activity, pass out a Bingo Card to every player. (Due to the natural variety of this game, everyone can have a copy of the same Bingo Card.) Explain that they will need to move around the room asking questions to identify people who match the descriptions on the card. Have them write the person's name in the box, and once they get 5 names in a row, shout "Bingo!" Review/confirm the answers in front of the group.

A) After the video, say: **"James was used to being left out and made fun of until these boys decided to get to know him and stand up for him. Not only was James' life changed, but so were the lives of his new friends. We all need people who like us for who we are. The best way to have good friends is to be a good friend."**

B) After the activity, say: **"In this game, we had to get to know other people by asking questions and being a good listener. These are two selfless qualities that can help you be a good friend to someone else. Ultimately, being a good friend means you treat others the way you want to be treated."**

Pass out the discussion cards or display the questions on your PowerPoint presentation and say: **"Take a few minutes to talk about *Being a Good Friend*."**

To start wrapping up say: **"OK dads, here's this month's Huddle Up Challenge: Do something fun with your kid(s) and at least one of their friends—maybe even with the friend's dad too."**

07

Prize Time and wrap up: Raffle off your prizes and then thank the dads for coming, announce the next meeting date (tell dads to go ahead and put a reminder on their calendars), and encourage everyone to invite a friend.

Bonus Activity: Invite any kids up to the microphone to share ways their dad is like a best friend.
